2001 AAFTA Nationals

In the past few months there has been a few problems within the *Mid South Tri-State Airgunners Association*. Any of you that read the last newsletter are aware of this fact. The club has fractured and many of the members left to form a new club. While AAFTA officially has no part in this club matter, the events that occurred caused the Board of Governors to revisit the bid submitted by MSTS that landed them the *2001 AAFTA Nationals*.

After discussing the bid and a few other factors for several weeks, all the governors felt it was prudent to rescind the awarding of the *AAFTA Nationals* to MSTS and call for new bids for the *Nationals*. Several factors played a roll in our decision. The main factor was that the original bid from MSTS included materials and manpower that are no longer accessible by the club as well as the plan for execution was compromised by the recent fracture. We felt that this invalidated the original bid submitted by MSTS. The Governors, in a 5-0 vote (with Wade Sutherland abstaining), decided it was best to restart the bidding process and allow all clubs to resubmit bids for the *Nationals*. All bids will be reviewed and the awarding will be based on the merits of the bids.

We have several clubs that have expressed an interest in holding the *Nationals* this year. One requirement that we are placing on all bidding clubs is that the original dates for the match, October 5-7, remain unchanged. So if you have already set aside vacation time for these dates you won't have to worry about changing your plans.

It is a shame that this has occurred but things like this do happen from time to time. We can only deal with it, move on and hope that with time the differences that have caused this can be reconciled. There is a silver lining in all that has happened and that is this; AAFTA has gained a new club, *Northern Mississippi Airgun Club (NMAC)*, with a new venue to shoot at.
