**P**reparations are still being made for the *Southern Spring Nationals Inaugural 2001 Match* in Hernando, Mississippi. The match is scheduled for the 1<sup>st</sup> weekend in May (5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup>), with the sight-in range being accessible on Friday, the 4<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 am.

As you may (or may not) know, this is a new venue in Hernando. Although it is new to everyone who may have attended MSTS matches in the past, the topography is very similar to the MSTS property, but the parking and access to the venue is much nicer, not to mention the property itself. Our gracious host, Dr. Mike Foster, has maintained this property (225 acres) like his own yard. He and the whole family use it like playground.

A long time to know someone in this game. He and Rodney were the names I was given by a guy in a gun shop here in Miami who has since come and gone. I contacted Rodney and made plans to drive up to West Palm Beach on Sunday. Rodney was shooting something or another, and Roy had an engraved HW77 with a Leupold 18-40 on it. I didn't have a gun worth shooting (a new in the box 77 with a Bushnell 4-16), so I was paired with Roy for the 40 shot match that Sunday, and shared his 77. I hit two. Roy spent many moments at the lanes guiding me in the fledgling science of rangefinding, hold of a spring gun, and trigger release. Generally, he did it all, shot his two, then gave me the gun all set up and told me where to aim. I shot more than my two pellets at each target to get those two hits out of forty. His words of wisdom....Invest in a decent scope. Over the years, I have tried to get him to shoot my Titan rifle with my latest inventions and innovations with minimal success. He generally just chuckled, and carried on pulverizing aspirins at 50 yards with his Ripley. I shared rooms with him at matches, was squadded with him, and got drunk into oblivion with him on more than one occasion. He was my coach. To say that the man has not impacted my life would be an injustice. To say that his passing has not affected me would be a lie. I am shaken. Rest well my friend, you will not be forgotten...I toast you with a Kesslers. Mel

The Courses are tucked away in the woods just off the sight-in range and very near to the parking area. There will be 2 courses with 13 lanes each and 50 shots per course. Right now the woods are still leafless, but Spring has sprung here in the Mid South and a metamorphosis will soon take place. We are still learning the nuances of our new venue and will obviously be discovering new and better things to do as we progress, but we are striving to put this match together with the best experience we can muster. Because of the topography with it's rolling hills and gullies, the seating positions could be slightly challenging at times, for example: your feet might be higher than your butt, or vise versa.

Food will be catered. Our traditional Catfish and fixin's will be served Sunday and Saturday will be catered by our Host, Mrs. Martha Foster, who happens to be a professional caterer. We also plan to have finger foods for the Friday crowd to help ease the problem of going to town to find somewhere to eat.

The Memphis in May Festival will be beginning the same weekend as our shoot and there will be outdoor concerts and festivities on the River the entire month of May. # TAMPA BAY MARCH MADNESS MATCH



Once upon a time there were several AAFTA affiliated clubs in Florida. The Sporting Air Riflemen of the Everglades Rifle and Pistol Club (a pre-AAFTA club), site of the first Nationals in '87 and the first Worlds in '91, which became FECA, the Florida East Coast Airgunners. The pre-AAFTA Wyoming Antelope Club Airgunners, now TBA, the Tampa Bay Airgunners. The Port Malabar Rifle and Pistol Club (PMRPC) which, with Brad Toyer at the helm, held many impressive state and regional matches and the '99 Nationals on its superb grounds. And, since 1998, the Pelitcan Airgunners at Dade City Rod and Gun Club (PEL).

Unfortunately, due to loss of habitat in the case of FECA, and loss of personnel in the case of PMRPC with Brad's move to Alabama, there are no regularly scheduled Field Target events anywhere in Florida except in the Tampa area. Because of this paucity, PEL and TBA will be holding Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning two day matches every one or two months. This will allow time for travel to and from the matches with only one night's lodging needed. These will be "no frills" matches; no awards, no meals, minimum expense, entry fee of \$5.00, forty shots (+ or -) each day.

The first of these, the March Madness Match, was held March 17th and 18th with fourteen participants. Saturday was cloudy and breezy with temperatures in the mid 70's. Sunday was overcast and breezy in the mid 60's. Not quite beach weather, but perfect for shooting.

Well the weather was great for our monthly shoot on Saturday, February 10. Clear skies, cool temperatures in the 40's rising to near 70°F by the end of the match, and only a slight but consistent 5-MPH breeze. March 2001 Shoot Results



A thunderstorm rolled through Usery Pass and the Rio Salado Sportsman's Club at about 5 AM drenching everything.
