2002 US Nationals Report

Hurricanes are funny things, they don't go where they are expected and don't do what you think they are going to do. The weather forecasters who try to predict what they are going to do usually have a clue, but they never have been very good at predicting the weather, thank God for the Farmers Almanac! As the shooters arrived for the 2002 AAFTA US Nationals the big concern was the weather. Hurricane Lili was in the Gulf of Mexico and the forecast early in the week was for Lili to travel up the Mississippi river and rain on our parade Thursday and Friday.

As it turned out, Lili dumped some rain on the range Thursday night but had blown through the area by Friday noon. We had instructed everyone to show up to shoot Friday morning, which they did. However, with the courses being soggy and the wind blowing water off the trees we decided delay the start of the match until 1:00 pm and hold the AAFTA elections, annual meeting and auction in the morning, eat lunch and then shoot.

We had 72 shooters show up to test their shooting skills at what is one of the toughest matches of the year, the Nationals. The toughness isn't just the difficulty level of the courses, which averaged around 36, but it is setting up the shots to test all of the shooters skills and setting the traps on the courses for the common mistakes.

After the rain cleared out, things dried out and then heated up on the courses. After the Friday match, we had two open shooters drop only one shot on the Gray course: Robert Crocker and Walt Roller who were tied for the lead at the end of the day. Paul Bishop was on fire as well in the Piston Class, dropping only 4 on the White course and leading the piston gun shooters with a score of 36.

But Saturday was a different day, a cold front went through the area and the temperature dropped into the low to mid 70's and it was beautiful. The leader board was all shook up at day's end with Don Carkhuff shooting a clean score 40 in Open Class on the Gray course that had a difficulty rating of 34.8 and that ain't no easy course! Both classes had a number of guys in position to win the Nationals in the final match on Sunday.

The Piston shooters were together on the last day shooting the Blue course which turned out to be the toughest of all the course. The 36.5 difficulty rating was only part of the story, there were several shots that really tested the shooter and their equipment including some very dark targets and some very windy shots. They confounded and frustrated many a shooter, yours truly included. The competition for Piston Class boiled down to two shooters: Roz Sumpter and Paul Bishop. Paul was leading at the beginning of the match with a score of 67 while Roz scored 65. Coming up to the last lane, Roz had dropped 7 shots and Paul 10 giving Roz a 1 shot lead. Roz sat down and cleaned his last lane to win the Piston Class National Championship

While all this was going on, over on the White course, Wade Sutherland was putting on a clinic, shooting the second clean score of 40 on a course with a difficulty of 36.9 with some really nasty windy shots. That was some really fine shooting, however it wasn't enough for the win as Steve Schulz and Bob Winer both continued their steady shooting and ended up tied for first in Open Class.

The tie was going to be decided in a shoot-off on the practice range. The shoot-off consisted of a 3/8" Bird at 28-29 yards, a 3/4" Bird at 41-42 yards and a 1" Quail past 50 yards. Each competitor would fire two shots at each target in 7 minutes for score. After a flip of a coin, Bob decided to shoot first and scored two hits. Steve sat down to the line and also recorded two kills. Another tie so on to sudden death where both guys shoot until one missed. Bob joined Steve at the line and fired one shot at the 3/8" bird, a miss. Steve ranged the target, gauged the wind and started the firing cycle. After a bit he stopped, took a breathe and checked his equipment and started again. He took aim at the target and fired, a hit! With that Steve became the Open Class National Champion. Congratulations to both shooters on some really fine shooting.

Considering how things were looking early in the week and the rain we received, all in all the match went really well. There were a few cold lines throughout the weekend but most were fairly minor problems that occur during the course of a match. The food and fellowship were both very good as is normally the case. Wade Sutherland was largely responsible for the planning and preparation of the range and courses and everyone I talked to agreed that he and those that help him did a fine job. All of the shooters conducted themselves in a very gentlemanly manner and made the whole weekend a lot of fun. Congratulations to Roz and Steve and all the shooters who participated this year.

In addition to our current governors Ken Hughes, David Slade and Wade Sutherland we had Joe Korick and Steve Schulz step up to the challenge of being a governor. After the ballots were counted, all of the incumbent governors were re-elected for another term. I would like to say thanks to Joe and Steve for volunteering for these positions and encourage them to run again next time.

The annual AAFTA auction was held after the elections with donated items from many individuals and companies. I would like to say thanks to everyone who donated the many items we auctioned this year and a special thanks to Falcon, Daystate, Airgunwerks and one anonymous donor who all donated air rifle and a pistol to the auction. I would also like to thank Ray Apelles who donated one of his personal shooting uniforms and hat that together brought over \$250 (thanks Warren and Eric!). The auction was lively and fun thanks to the many generous shooters and we raised over \$4400 for AAFTA.

The governors talked about a lot of different issues this year, many of which we decided that no action was the right action. A lot of what we discussed was centered on the newsletter. After a lot of discussion and some ranting and raving, the board voted to raise the cost of the Associate Membership to \$25 and also decided that our member clubs would now be assessed a yearly fee of \$25, both starting in January 2003.

Part of our newsletter problems has been trying to get people to renew their associate membership on time and keeping the records up to date. To make life easier for everyone, we have decided that starting in 2004, all AAFTA associate membership will be renewed on the same month. That way a renewal notice can be printed in the AAFTA news to remind everyone to re-up. Over the course of the next year, all renewals will be pro-rated to the common renewal date that is June 1st.

We have had a lot of Associate members suggest emailing the newsletter to those who would like to receive it electronically. We asked for a show of hands at the annual meeting to see how many associate members would like to receive the newsletter by email and it was over 90% of those present. We are exploring this option but I want to reassure everyone that the newsletter will still be available in hardcopy to those who want to receive it that way. If we implement an email newsletter, we will let every know how to sign up to receive it by that method.

The governors also presented a by-law change to Article IV to the AAFTA membership that changes the singular notation of the national championship trophy and XXX. This will allow AAFTA to buy a single or multiple trophies for the National Champion (s) each year. The changed was passed unanimously by the membership and will appear in the next edition of the rulebook.

The last thing the Governors talked about was the location of next years Nationals. We had basically two clubs that had bids for next year's match and in our great wisdom we awarded the 2003 Nationals to Western Wayne County Conservation Association in Michigan. The decision was pretty easy for us and I am sure that Rick Stoutenburg and crew will put on good match.

That about covers its. The only other thing I have to relay to you is that Wade Sutherland and myself will be stepping down from our position at the end of the year. Ken Hughes will be taking over as Chairman while Cliff Smith will be assuming the Sec/Treas. Duties. I would like to thank these Wade for his commitment to AAFTA over these past few years and to Ken and Cliff for taking up the responsibilities for the next few years. It has been an honor for me to lead the board these past three years and I know that both Ken and Cliff will do an excellent job in the years to come.

The third annual Badgerlands are now history and the new 2-day format was a welcomed success. We did have a few shooters with scheduling conflicts, but we were glad to see them make it for at least one day. The match was still held at 100 shots and fired on two separate course set-ups, using our entire field target course on both days. We fired the odd numbered lanes on Saturday and the even lanes on Sunday. This time Bill recruited his lovely wife, Maureen, to do the cooking and match day preparations. The weather sure made the last match interesting. The temperature made it up to the mid 40s for a short time and the wind was brisk, gusting close to 20 miles per hour at times. On our first break, we had a real good shower, which made the break a little longer, but didn't slow thinks down much. With some hot chocolate and warm clothing, things were great.

Hans thought of a new way for us to set a match up and it was real interesting, particularly the last round. There were twelve turkey targets in twelve lanes and two shots were taken per lane. Three rounds were shot and the kill zones became smaller for each lane. The kill for the first round on every target was 1.24" and the average difficulty was 24.8T. For the second round, the reducer was changed to 1", to make an average difficulty of 30.7T. The last round was shot with a .625" kill and had an average difficulty of 49.2T. This gave the 72 shot match an average difficulty of 34.9T. With two targets at 40+ yards and 3 more from 30-36 yards, the reduced kill zones were a real challenge in the wind. Significant holdover was even necessary for the 20 –29 yard targets. Doping the wind correctly was definitely the formula for success.

The hit percentage in round one was 81.8%, for round two, it was 77.1% and for round three, it fell to 66.1%. Playing the wind to hit a .625 kill at 42 yards is a challenge. The scores were quite good considering the difficulty of the course and harsh weather conditions. I think the cold may have gotten to Hans and Noel as well as some others to a lesser degree. I felt good for the whole match, losing one to the wind and just released the trigger at the wrong time to miss the second, ending up with a 70/72 to take first. Danny mowed down the targets with his .22cal AA410 to score a 66/72 and second place. Dennis was kicking himself for a few of the misses on the larger kills, but managed a 65/72 to take third. The three of us each took home a frozen turkey for our efforts.

The fun match was rather explosive and a lot of fun. Numbered wooden stakes, about 1' tall, were placed in the ground at various ranges, from low 20s to just about 30 yards. They had 2" square targets on them, with about a .5" bull-seye. We drew numbers to see which one we would shoot at and then had to shoot an offhand shot to try to hit the bull. On the first round I very uncharacteristically hit the bull on my offhand shot. The top half of the stick disappeared and the blast certainly got everyone's attention. There were two more hidden and detonated by two other shooters. George, Doug and myself were the fortunate ones and were rewarded with one of Hans' field targets each.

Many thanks to Hans for thinking up this unique match and for supplying the targets and kill zone reducers. The fun match was a blast and another one of Hans' ideas.

The Christmas shoot will be on December 8th and I'm sure there will be some fun targets again this year. I look forward to seeing everyone again to shoot the breeze as well as some targets and scarf down some pizza.
