Mid-Atlantic Regionals, May 17& 18, 2003

The first-ever Regionals at DIFTA, the Airgun Field Target club of the Wildlife Achievement Chapter of the Izaak Walton League, were held on May 17 and 18, 2003. This match consisted of three courses of fire with 40 shots each; two were shot on Saturday and one on Sunday for a total of 120 shots. Shooters came from MD, VA, WV, PA, NY, CT and Bob Winer even came all the way from California for this match!

In spite of the dim weather forecast for Saturday we had no rain, but it was very humid and cold with a light, variable wind. The thick cloud cover made some shots appear to be very dark. After the morning match, Bob Winer was in the lead in Open Class with a score of 37 of 40, and Ray Apelles and Paul Bishop were tied for first in Piston Class with a score of 31. In Junior Class, Bevin Watters took the lead with 52 points (scoring in junior class awards two points for a falling target and one point for a face plate hit) and I was first in Standing Class with 20 points.

Hunter FT also allows some of our local airgunners who aren't interested in shooting the competitive style a chance to bring their sporter plinking and hunting airguns out and have some fun with them. We shot the course in under 1½ hours and everyone had a great time. We offer both Piston and PCP classes but on this day no one shot PCP class. The top score in Piston class was shot by Bill Greene who managed to knock down 24 critters while Roz Sumpter was right on his heels with a 23. Special cudos goes to Ken Hughes who shot a TX200 for the first time and scored 19 kills.

The competition course was a bit more difficult and more on par to what the experienced FT shooters have come to expect. It rated a 34 on the difficulty scale and had several challenging and interesting shots. With a front going through the area we had some pretty tricky wind to deal with especially on lane five.
