The game of Mini Field Target has been written about in the AAFTA News now for the full 2003 season, but most of you probably don't have a clue as to how the game is played, the type of targets that are used, nor the distances at which the targets are placed. This article will shed some light on this very exciting new game that was solely designed to bring more people into the game of Field Target.

How would you like to triple your membership? Think of Mini Field Target as a stepping-stone into real Field Target. As most of you already know, most of the airgunners out there are back yard shooters and squirrel hunters using cheap, or should I say inexpensive, airguns to shoot with. The majority of people who buy airguns use them to rid their back yards of squirrels or buy them as a stepping-stone into the world of "real guns." They don't realize that airguns are the best training tool to practice with to improve their shooting prowess.

Field Target as it is now played is a wonderful game, but here again, you must invest a hefty sum of money just to get into it! Mini Field Target eliminates a lot of the drawbacks that stop the average airgun shooter from entering into Field Target. A stepping stone, if you will, an easy way to experience Field Target without all the shock of see what is needed to compete: the cost, the difficulty, and the experience necessary to compete.

It all started as a training exercise for the NJROTC unit at Millington Central High School where I was the shooting coach for some 4 years or so. I used field targets to help make the shooting exercises more fun! It was a big success. On December 5th, 2000 my team and the Craigmont team competed at the 1st official Mini Field Target match ever. Even though it was indoors and the distance was only ten yards, the kill zones were small enough to offer a real challenge to those ten-meter paper-punchers. When the game was moved outdoors, the target distance moved to 20 yards and now finally to 100 to 25 yards maximum.

Shooting with low-powered airguns in Mini Field Target can really help to move airgun shooters into the real game of Field Target. The challenge is making and setting up the targets correctly. These mini field targets come in several variations from as large as eight to ten inches tall to small size minis of only two to five inches tall plus regular field targets with kill zones. We typically don't use regular field targets with kill zones smaller than one inch, but on special occasions, such as our Halloween Shoot, we can go very small, but remember to keep it fun for all.

The Mid-South Tri/State Airgunners Association uses eight lanes with four targets per lane and two shots per target. Two of the targets are mini field targets and the other two are regular field targets. The left sides of the lane uprights are where we place the mini field target reset strings, and the right sides are for the regular target strings. We have at least one adult per lane and we use gun racks at each lane to help keep things safe. This 32 shot course for both mini and regular field target really brings it all together.

Since both classes of shooters use the same lane, they both get an opportunity to see what the other class has to shoot at. A broad mix of minis would be 70% large size, 20% medium size, and 10% regular kill zone field targets. 85 to 90% of the targets used are just targets hinged at the base with no real kill zone - just a 1-1/2" black aiming spot set against a white target background with black details on the target face. These targets must be set so light that the wind almost knocks them over - if not, the mass of these 1/8" large steel targets won't fall with the lightest pellet strikes.

Mini Field Target is for everyone, and any type of pellet rifle or pistol shooting as slow as 400 FPS can be used. The regular field targets also need to be set very light to fall with a hit to the paddle as low as one to two foot-pounds of energy. Again, setup is very important to a successful match.

Note: Even though you set the targets as light as possible, they usually won't fall if a shot is placed much lower than the center of the target. I usually mention to aim center to high for a successful kill, because just like in regular Field Target, the target must fall to be scored as a kill.

Our club motto is, "An airgun club for the entire family." If you really want your club to grow, then try Mini Field Target as a stepping-stone into real Field Target.

NY State FT Championships ~ Field Target Match Review EFTCC @ DCPA 11/16/2003

Sunday morning was here. Up at zero dark thirty to meet Dennis Verhagen for the 3 hour trek to participate in the NY State FT Championships being held by the Eastern Field Target Competitor's Club at the Dutchess County Pistol Association range. Yes, say that five times real fast...Weather forecast was looking good, sunny with estimated temps in the high 40's, and most importantly little wind expected. It was 44 already when I left the house. Not too shabby for mid-November. Meet Dennis at his home and as we're getting ready to leave we look out and happen to notice that it's raining. Hmmmmm. OK, it's going to pass, weather report mentioned nothing about this. After an uneventful ride, although we did see a dead wolf on the side of the road (yes it was a wolf I tell you, that's my story and I'm sticking to it) we arrive in NY, car thermometer says 33 degrees. Light rain had been intermittent for the whole trip. The sight-in range was already bustling with activity when we arrived. Ray Apelles was mired in paperwork in the shack and got us registered. Once back outside to sight in and warm up, Hans Apelles explained the safety rules to me as it was my first time there and only the fourth match I had ever participated in. Fourth match in three weekends, but I'm hooked now and see many more in the future. Take a few 35 – 40 yard shots with my trusty RWS 94 and see that I'm at least capable of hitting an 8.5x11 sheet of paper and figure all is well, that's some fine shooting for me. Looking down the firing line I see a guy shooting a monster spring gun, it's the legendary Paul Bishop. Tom Watters and his sharp shooting junior crew were hard at it. A total of 25 people came out to participate in the match and there were several spectators as well. It was certainly going to be a great day.

About 9:45 we packed up and headed up to the FT range. The course was made up of 13 lanes, 2 targets per lane, and 2 shots per target for a total of 52 shots. There was a lane (or maybe 2, it's a week later now...) designated for standing offhand shooting only and one for kneeling. Also the 75 yard bonus target which counted for bragging rights only. Very nicely laid out. There were also a few handicapped targets that could be shot as an option in Hunter and Offhand Class. Still nippy, but no wind and so far it's staying dry. Ray worked on making up the squads and Hans held the Shooters Meeting. Light rain now and it starts getting muddy. I got squadded up with George Blass and Eve Sturdevant who were both shooting Eve's new S200, and the three of us comprised the Hunter Class.

A siren goes off beside us caused by Cpt Bob Ford hitting the 75 yard bonus target standing and shooting offhand and he ended up winning the Open Class competition. And the 50/50 drawing... Gopal Jambavat also hit the 75 yard target standing, and went on to take 1st in the Offhand Class. John Way, Laura Mendez, Mike Cohen, Ray Apelles, and Junior Class sensation Bevin Watters also had no problems hitting that killzone way out there at 75 yards.

Superman with a Spring Gun Paul Bishop shot his way to another 1^{st} place victory as well as having the overall match high score of 45. A tie for 2^{nd} went to Paul Cray, shooting it out with Mike Cohen. Both of them scored a 36.

As mentioned previously, Cpt Bob Ford took 1^{st} in Open Class with a score of 44, followed by a tie for 2^{nd} won by John Way in a shootout with Dennis Verhagen. Their scores were tied at 41.

Also mentioned previously Gopal Jambavat captured 1st in the Offhand Class with a 44, followed by Jim Wilcox with a 35, and Joe Giunti with a 27.

Hunter Class turned out to be a heated competition between George Blass and Eve Sturdevant with George taking 1st place in a shoot off, their scores a 31. I brought up the rear with a 22.

Junior Class was won by Danielle Diorio with the outstanding score of 92. If scored on the regular adult scoring system her score would have been a 40. Absolutely incredible, this girl can shoot! 2nd place went to Bevin Watters with a score of 62 and 3rd to Andrew McGee with a 61. Venkat Jambavat also was a delight to watch shooting a Diana 70 with open sights. This little guy scored a fantastic 29.

Eventually the rain stopped and it warmed up a bit and it was indeed a fine day. After the awards were handed out and the targets brought in a large group went to the Hometown Buffet to enjoy some good food and lively conversation. Many thanks to the "A" Team for their hard work putting this match together and bringing it off without a hitch. AAFTA Rule Changes

The following rule changes/clarifications were discussed and adopted at the 2003 AAFTA Meeting in Detroit. As promised, here is the official wording as adopted by the AAFTA Governors:

Discharge rule:

5. Scoring:

- A) Same
- B) Same
- C) When the gun is shouldered, any discharge of air down the barrel and/or disengagement of the sears shall be recorded as a miss if the target does not fall. A shooter may announce their intention to discharge the gun into the ground without the penalty of a miss.

Time Per Shot

11) Time per shot:

- A) The match director and/or marshal may impose a time limit per lane or per target either before or during a match. Match directors should note the use and limits of timers in the match announcement, if possible. Timers should be of the countdown type with an audible alarm when time runs out. Typical time allowed is 1 minute per shot with 1 minute set up time per lane, ex: 4 shots on a lane equals 5 minutes of time for that lane.
- B) The timer can be started by a squad member or the shooter, and can be placed so the shooter can monitor his or her own time. Timers are to be started when the shooter 1) sits down for a sitting shot or 2) shoulders the rifle for the first time for kneeling / standing shot or 3) lays down for a prone shot.
- C) If a "cold" line/ cease-fire is called while the timer is active, stop the timer and add an additional 15 seconds to the time remaining and restart the timer when "hot" line/ resume-fire is called.
- D) Any shots taken after the alarm sounds will be counted as a miss. In case of a tie with the alarm, and the squad members agree on the tie, then the shot is given to the shooter. A marshal or the match director will handle any disputes.
