CARS CALIFORNIA ACCURATE RIFLE SHOOTERS

<u>April 18, 2004</u>

Field Target Match

Even though this was Grand Prix weekend in Long Beach, the CARS field target match went on as scheduled. Eight shooters started and 7 completed the 44 shot event. Of note: there were no off-hand shots --- thought we'd take a break from the usual 10% off-hand. Weather the day before the match was miserable (rain and wind), but match day saw pleasant temperatures with fairly mild wind conditions. While wind was a factor with some of the smaller hit zones, the major impact was with those targets beyond 40 yards. As has been done on occasion in the past, I posted the target yardages on the scorecards. Since this has not been shown to have a major effect on results at our matches, the yardage was included to help people check their scopes.

Although we had a small group, the shooting was exciting and the results were very special. Our very own <u>Vipha</u> <u>Miller</u> shot an amazing 32/44 (73%) on a very difficult course, and she was crowned <u>Match Winner!</u> I have watched Vipha shoot over the past few years and can honestly state that she has shown phenomenal improvement, and has become a real contender. Congratulations Vipha on a well deserved win. Hubby Doug Miller was one shot behind, even though he tried to rattle his wife on the last few lanes. Well, 1st and 2nd places did go to the Miller homestead. Leo Hwong was 3d and John Spencer 4th. Leo, you've just been shooting too much rimfire and not enough airgun. John's scope zero was way off and it took him a bit to get everything settled. Dave Frederick and Mike Marcelli shot very well with tie scores. Mike Sosenko has returned to the fold and shot an impressive 21/44 using my Steyr. For those who have seen my rig, you can appreciate the major ergonomic handicap that Mike faced. Once he got settled in, this guy was hot! I wouldn't be surprised if Mike's field target shooting eventually rose to the level of his superb centerfire and rimfire benchrest games.

While the CARS field target matches have a substantial difficulty level, folks do enjoy and profit from the challenge. Today's match had a difficulty level (Troyer) of 45.7. The average score was 26/44 (59%) with 63% of the shots being a hit. The absence of off-hand targets may have been a factor in our results today, but I think that shooting our challenging courses has contributed to overall improvement.

This was a 60 target match and the scoring was done in a different manner, shooters were compelled to knock down each target, with every shot added to your score with a maximum of 4 points per target. When the match was over the individual shooting the least number of shots was declared the winner. The results had very little effect on the standings from the conventional scoring method but did allow the individual that missed to get in a few extra shots and attempt to figure out why they had missed. The idea came from the Biathlon in the Olympics where cross country skiing and shooting small bore rifles are combined, the difference being that they run against the clock and we counted shots.

Our final assessment indicates that this was a very difficult match with a number of the targets practically straight down or very high on the bank across the gully. A very different set-up for the flatlanders from Wisconsin, however, they did show their expertise by wiping out the Minnesota contingency. There were a number of very long shots that tested the range finding ability of each individuals' scopes.

The weather was ideal and the food was good: what more can you ask for on a Saturday in May. We thank the contestants that drove up from Wisconsin and the support we received from our MAFTA club in Minnesota.
