Wow, it was a cool one this morning but turned out to a pretty good day weatherwise. It never did get warm but for most the morning we had a lot of sunshine and though it was cool, if properly dressed, one was comfortable for the most part. The sunshine reflecting off the back and side of the scope caused some shooters problems in seeing the target in a darkened lane. Rick Stoutenberg, John Lykins and Bill Dodt set up the lanes on Saturday. Bill is new to field target and cannot be held responsible for the size of many of the KZ's. It's interesting that John nor Rick shot today. Rick did say that John wanted to sprinkle in many more of the smaller KZ's but he, Rick, jumped in to save us from that. Thanks, Rick! John wasn't at the match and could not defend himself!! It was a 60 shot match on 15 lanes. We got started about 10:15-10:30 and finished about 1:30 or so. We had one 3 man team that had two lanes to go after everyone else was finished so we worked around them and took done the other 13 lanes as well as the practice range. Lunch was served at the 200 yard range during a Precision Rifle match that drew people from Ontario, Indiana and other parts of the country. The lunch was part of the \$10.00 entry fee in lieu of award plaques.

Welcome back ! Jim Sarnacki showed up for his first match this year and went home as Match Winner. He shot a 57x60 on a moderately difficult course. I do not know what the rating would be on the Troyer scale but it wasn't an easy course. There may have been some full size KZ's but I don't recall seeing any. On the other hand, I did see a good deal of small and smaller KZ's. With this kind of expertise available to us I am sure we'll be able to challenge the very best shooters at the Nationals late next year. One thing you guys might want to consider is the fact that timers were used at the Nationals and will be used at '03 Nationals as well. This was the first time I used them and it is a little disconcerting knowing the clock is ticking, you are range finding and can't locate the target, you are down to 2 minutes and have four shots to go. The big plus is that nearly everyone finishes at the same time and overall the match moved along a better clip than without timers. So consider using your watch in your practice sessions in addition to your rifle , bum bag, etc.

I mentioned earlier we had a new shooter with us today. I was squadded with Bill Dodt and Rich Nowak. Bill used a RWS 45 with a BSA 2x7 scope and he used hold over/under rather than clicking the elevation knob. Does this bring back memories when we were all just a little more innocent regarding equipment? While Bill didn't burn up the course he did well and we hope to see him back with again in the future. The weather and temperature shifts affected a few of the PCP rifles as you can see below. Some of our stalwarts with PCP's didn't fare as well as they usually do. Rick Stewart borrowed one Rick Stoutenburg's TX's and did quite well. He has purchased a HW97 but returned it to seller because of a sloppy barrel.

I want to publicly thank and acknowledge Ken Reeves help in writing the newsletter in August and September in my absence. Thanks, Ken!

Waterloo Field Target Club Christmas Fun Match December 8, 2002

On the drive to the match, it was clear and about 25°. The temperature did not change much, but the wind sure did. On the outdoor section of the match, the wind chill was about 5° and the blowing snow sometimes obscured the target. We had 9 targets and 18 shots outdoors, which was more than enough for most shooters. On a 44 yard target, with a direct cross breeze, the pellets from my SS/ld at 910 ft/sec, were moving 4-6 inches. Bill, shooting the heavy .22 pellets faired the best and nailed that 44 yarder twice.

Indoors, there were four fun/skill activities. The first was a moving ceramic bird that you had three shots to hit. If you hit it on the first shot, you scored 30 points, second shot 20 points, ... Everyone made the bird disappear on the first attempt.

The second challenge was the rotating wheel with nine pieces of chalk sticking out. The chalk would appear above a wall and travel across with about .5" showing above the wall at its apex. Shooters had nine shots to see how many they could turn to dust. I have always liked this event and managed to dust all nine. Maybe using chalk all day as a teacher gives me an edge.

Shooting fish in a barrel was the next event. We used a paper target where the white bull got smaller as you shot lower in the barrel and the points increased accordingly. There were three fish per line, starting at 5 pts each, 10, 20, 30 and 40 for the bottom line. Most tried the bottom three lines, as you could only shoot each fish once and had nine shots. Dennis and I were close on this one as he touched the edge on two targets, while I missed one 40 pointer.

The final feat was to put ten shots inside ten .375" circles without breaking the line. Inside scored 100 and the points went down as you broke the different rings. Bill and Andrew did a great job with their larger .22 pellets, but I was able to keep all those **little** pellets inside the center ring.

At the end, Hans had a small Christmas tree decorated with a variety of toy cap firing guns and we chose in order of finish. At the top, he had one of his brass and wood-stocked TX200s, which I was fortunate enough to choose. We also completed our gift exchange and everyone went home with two treasures and a belly full of pizza.

As usual, hats off to Hans for a fun day and some challenging events. We hibernate now until the first match of Spring. Have a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year everyone.

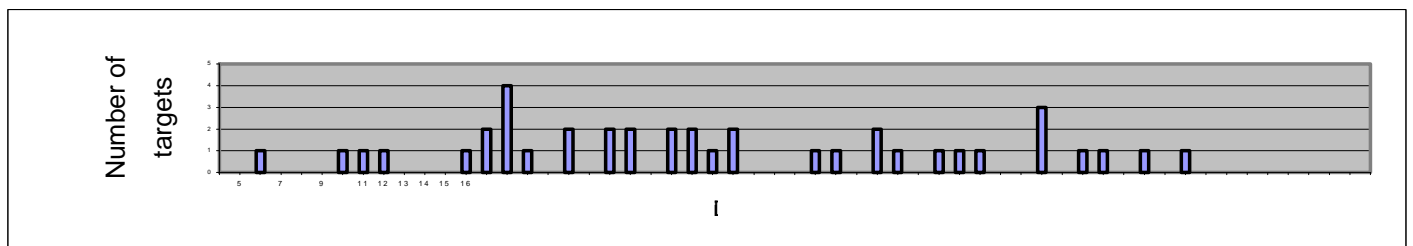

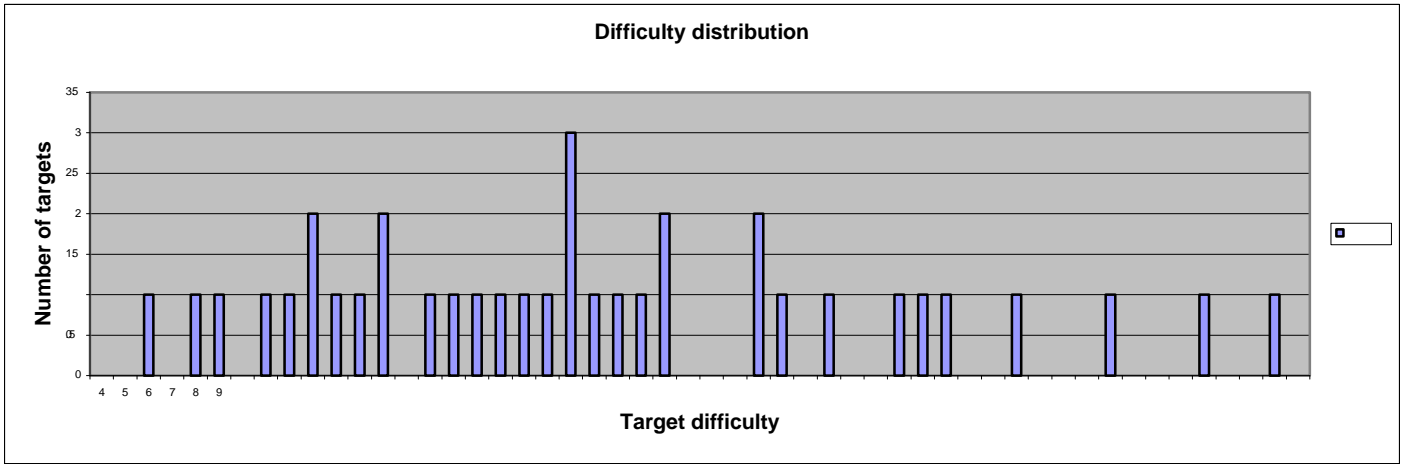
A gorgeous fall day with temperatures rising from the upper 50s into the mid 60s, nice sunshine and beautiful foliage! A very light crosswind was barely perceptible and did not interfere much with our pellets' pilgrimage to the face plates of the longer targets. This course had 3 targets each on 12 lanes for a total of 72 shots. Junior class was scored with two points for a falling target and one point for a face plate hit. The target difficulty distribution is shown below. This match had an average difficulty of 25T; the hardest shot this time was not a long-distance shot but a 1/2" KZ frog at 27 yards.

We had Cliff Smith as a guest all the way from Florida, and Tom Watters shot an FT gun he built himself. Werner Wicha shot a Falcon he had bought the day before, having no scope dope and using "I guess that's right" holdover. Most of you are familiar with the "DNF" for "did not finish"; my son Michael did not want to get out of bed that morning and thus receives a "DNS" for "did not start", that lazy bum.

In piston class we had a three-way shoot-off. for the MD State Champion's trophy. As is customary here at DIFTA, Long Tom (Ron Juneau's big turkey with a 1" kill zone at about 47 yards this time) was used to break the tie. Since this is a difficult shot, we held a two-shot sudden death shoot-off. Cliff Smith won the coin toss and chose to shoot first, followed by Ray Apelles and then Rex Gori.

In the first round, noone hit the target. In the second round, Cliff Smith hit the target with his first shot; all other shots in this round were also misses. In the third round for second place, Ray Apelles used his first shot to take a sighter on the face plate of the target and then fell the target with his second shot. Rex Gori missed both times. I have to say that I was impressed by Ray's guts to take a sighter shot during a sudden death shoot-off! Lots of match experience and a good portion of confidence do make a difference.

NY State Championships ~ Field Target Match Review EFTCC @ DCPA 11/17/2002

Well the weather was less than desirable and the driving conditions for shooters from the north seemed like the match could have very well been a bust. The non-stop rain for 4 days prior to the match and forecast for 100% rain on match day forced us to take drastic measures. We scrapped the plan we had been organizing for 2 months and started over. Luckily I was able to get last minute approval from the DCPA officials and acquired use of 2 of the heated ranges for the entire day's shoot. DCPA has 4 ranges. (2 heated pistol ranges where you shoot through windows to the targets that are outdoors, 1 outdoor but covered range, and the Airgun only range which is completely uncovered) SO with approval to use the 2 heated and covered pistol ranges a new plan was devised. We used the Outdoor covered rapid fire bay for 2 sitting lanes and one other sitting lane through a door that leads from range 1 out to the target range. That gave us but 3 sitting lanes so they were made very difficult. Using the rest

of range 1 and range 2 for 12 additional standing lanes yielded a 60 shot match on 15 lanes with 2 targets per lane. If it was not for DCPA's facilities we would have had to call the entire event off and probably not been able to reschedule with it being so close to Thanksgiving. Anyway a Big THANK YOU goes out to DCPA and its membership.

Now with this being a last minute affair we were not able to plan the target layout as much as we normally do. The original plan for the NY State championship was a 29 difficulty but this one ended up being a 36. Longer shots off-hand push up the difficulty pretty quickly even with full sized kill zones. With the heavy rains after the match setup many of the targets were partially under water so changing them just before the match would have been difficult

Despite the weather we had 20 shooters participate. There 3 juniors that had never shot Field Target before, one of which had never picked up a gun before. But Danielle's little brother Michael (Mercadante) showed her the ropes. Michael had shot in some of DCPA's Junior Silhouette matches. Danielle Diorio showed her father how to shoot her rifle as they shared it throughout the match. Danielle had placed first in her division at the DCPA Junior Silhouette Championship so she is also an accomplished shooter. Bevin Watters and father Tom Watters are both accomplished FT Shooters and this was their first time with us as well. Joe Giunti brought 2 new shooters for the Off-Hand class (Gopal and Mohan Jambavat). Gopal is an accomplished Pistol shooter. He shared Joe's airgun and I saw him knock down (from the off-hand position) some of the targets that the sitting shooters had trouble with. Wait till he gets his own equipment. He is going to do well very quickly. Dennis Verhagen and Glenn Storm were also First time shooters with us but neither was new to FT as the scores above clearly shows. Thanks to all who made the trip out in the treacherous conditions.

Now with all of the diverse conditions and difficult targets a score of 50% would have been exceptional. And still all of the NY State champions had well beyond that score. My hat goes off to each and every one of you. Some interesting notes about the match were..... Every shot seemed to create a splash in the puddles around the target. Whether it was the pellet splatter coming off the target, the pellet completely missing the target or the target itself making the splash as it went down. There was more action during this match than any other I can remember. You could actually see those completely missed shots as the splash clearly gave them away. I know as I had 2 of those on the same target. No Metal at all. Just splashes past the target. I laughed so hard after the first shot that I probably missed the second because of it. Other points were that there were no target malfunctions and not one cold line. That says a lot about a match. No one remembers when there are no cold lines but they sure remember when there are. No one got wet throughout the match and no one timed out either. Thanks to all the shooters that helped with the target cleanup after the match. It was greatly appreciated. A special thank you goes to Paul Bishop, who showed up a day early, for the help with the target setup in the rain on Saturday night. Door Prizes were donated by DCPA and the Beautiful awards were purchased from Bob Zimmerman, pictures of which can be found in the online photo album (URL below).

Even with the high level of competition we all had a lot of fun at this very difficult Impromptu setup match. Thanks to all of the shooters who made it so successful. This was our most highly attended match to date. If the weather had been better, so that the regular shooters could have attended, we would have had 30 shooters or more. Thanks to Joe Dennis and Dennis Verhagen for keeping me laughing throughout the match. These guys make the match even more fun than it already is.

After the match I received a few emails from shooters that could not attend. One shooter had to attend a funeral and a number of shooters had family in the hospital. Our prayers and condolences go out to the Cohen, Bowne and Heusinger families.

2002 Louisiana State Championship Spring Gun Field Target Match

The 13th annual Louisiana State Championship Field Target match was held at the Jean Lafitte Airgun Range in Baton Rouge on Saturday, November 9th. For the last two years, participation in this event has been restricted to spring gunners. This year's match saw an increase in out-of-staters traveling to Bayou country to come shoot with us.

The weather promised mild temperatures and clear skies, and that promise held until 10:30 am, when the skies darkened and a very light drizzle began. An overwhelming majority of the shooters indicated that they wanted to continue shooting unless conditions deteriorated. As it turned out, the sprinkles quit and the sun came out immediately after the match ended.

Twenty-three shooters competed in the dark woods of Belle Terre in this fifty point match. Timers were used and allowed shooters a generous six minutes to take four shots. There were numerous small kill zones at close to moderate ranges, four offhand shots, and a couple of targets out past fifty yards. There was a small bird target inside a hollow log which was extremely difficult to see. There was also a split alligator target worth 1/2 point per hit. Match Director Ron Juneau planned a difficulty level of thirty, but forgot to factor in the darkened woods, standing shots and shots longer than forty yards. Some veteran shooters remarked that this was the most challenging course they had ever shot in Baton Rouge. This was reflected in the scores as shown in the chart below. There was a tie for third place between Roz Sumpter and Rod Bradley. Roz took the award based on his performance on three pre-designated tiebreaker lanes.

After the Match, shooters were damp, tired and hungry. My sweet wife Linda served us a delicious meal consisting of her famous hot dogs and chili, soft drinks, brownies and carrot cake.
