Republic of Texas Field Target Match May 6-7, 2006

Please join us for the second annual Republic Of Texas (ROT) Field Target Match, at the new Yegua Airgun Range in Somerville, Texas. The event is proudly hosted by the Yegua Airgun Club (YAC), and the Central Texas Airgun Club (CTAC). Activities will include: FT match (Saturday afternoon and Sunday morning), IFP match (Saturday morning), Bus Tour (Saturday morning), 'Red Ryder' BB-gun match (Saturday afternoon), and a 'Spot-light Hunter' match (Saturday after dark).

We will allow shooting on 2 classes: 'PCP' or 'Piston' (AAFTA rules), plus 'Hunter' (CTAC rules). To do so, you must fill out 2 registration forms (and will be counted as 2 shooters), but you will get a discount on the second rifle. The 'Hunter' rifle must be shot first on every lane.

CTAC Hunter Rules:

- 1) Scope magnification set at 12x maximum
- 2) Scope AO can be focused on the target, but can't be used for range-finding (Yardage markings will be taped-over)
- 3) No clicking for elevation or windage (mil-dots are OK)
- 4) Sporter-style stocks only (no match-style stocks)
Adj cheek-piece & butt-pad are OK (up/down only, no canting - e.g., an R11 stock is OK)
- 5) No aids attached to rifle, except a sling (no butt-hook, no knee-rest, no tight-rest, no bi-pods)
- 6) No aids supporting rifle, or shooter (no sticks, no leaning on trees).
- 7) No aids on shooter (no harness, no jackets, knee or elbow pads on shooter are OK)
- 8) Same course, same targets, same shooting positions as regular FT (no buckets, no chairs)

Changes planned for the 2006 Good Ole Boy Match (June 10th & 11th)

It never ceases to amaze me what the human mind is capable of conceiving. Given liberty to explore a task or concept at leisure, there seems to be no end to our creativity when challenged. From building a better mouse trap to putting a man into space; or even just improving our scores at Field Target matches. Somebody has a better idea!

As we commonly say in this neck of the woods: 'It's all good!'

Many years ago I learned that a question not asked can lead to a life of confusion. The road not taken; a life of regrets. Too bad more of us don't step outside of our comfort zone, and fear of being criticized. When strongly convicted to act, why not say it or do it and adjust your position as things develop. You may ultimately find this more satisfying than standing in silence along the sidelines.

There is a scene in "The Pueblo", an old Steve McQueen movie. It involved a crewmate of the U.S.S. gunship Pueblo, who had been apprehended by Chinese nationalists as they were coming to power. The crewmate was seized on a nearby dock, in close proximity to the Pueblo and its onlooking crew. The crewmate was being subjected to the 'death of a thousand cuts' by his abductors. McQueen's character implored the captain of the Pueblo to take action in response to what was happening to the unfortunate crewmate on the dock. The captain responded that due to diplomatic guidelines and treaties in place, he could not take action for fear of a major international incident. McQueen's character looked toward the captain in disgust and yelled "Well, shoot something." He then picked up a service rifle and fired it into the body of the agonizing crewmate.

How often have we found ourselves in the position of the captain of the Pueblo? We feel hamstrung by rules and guidelines that constrain us from doing that which we strongly feel compelled to do. Or, does there come a breaking point when we rebel, as did Steve McQueen, and take matters into our own hands. -do we become the "Outlaw?"

At the 2006 G.O.B. Championship Field Target Match, there will be an "OUTLAW" division. For those field target competitors among you who have felt incumbered by existing constraints, the rein is loosened. Just come to the Good Ole Boy and let it all hang out.

What is involved with the Outlaw Division is as follows:

...There will only be one trophy provided for this division unless we receive 5 or more entries for this new division.

...All Outlaw entries will be squaded with one another in three person squads. They will not be mixed in with the other two divisions.

...The Outlaws are not subject to timers.

...The Outlaws must take offhand shots as designated, however they may employ any assistance or device conceivable in so doing.

...An Outlaw is subject to two shots X the number of targets, but not two shots per target, He can shoot any lane target in order of preference and with prejudice. ie; if there are three targets on a lane, the Outlaw shooter may start with any of the three. He may also continue shooting at the same target until able to drop it twice. After dropping the target twice, the Outlaw must select another lane target to go after, IF he still has shots remaining in the allocated six (6). The process continues in this manner until the six shots have been exhausted.

...Outlaw shooters are allowed a 22 fpe limit on airgun power rather than the standard 20 fpe.

At this writing there is still plenty of time remaining before the June 10th and 11th match date. So, if any of you who plan to attend this match have ideas or other input you would care to offer, please do so by contacting me prior to April 15th, 2006. It is the fervent desire of the G.O.B. Airgun Club to conduct its matches in a festive manner. In keeping with that we encourage all in attendance to come with an attitude of good will towards our fellow man. (Competitor?) We only go around once in this life. Let's have a little fun with it. And at the same time try to provide the other fellow with some as well. Wear your outlaw garments, share your funny jokes, keep your friendliest smile handy and don't take yourself so serious.

Be ye an Outlaw or not, let's all try to run with the big dogs.
