A big thanks to everyone who participated in the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Republic of Texas Field Target Competition from February 29 – March 2, 2008.

On Friday, February 29<sup>th</sup>, we started with an NRA Rifle Silhouette match. That evening at 7:30, we held the First Ever Candlelight Shoot. This was a new addition to the ROT. We had many concerns about the candles staying lit and also, if anyone would show interest in this type of competition. When it was time to start the match, we had 18 shooters showing interest in competing. That was enough interest for me! For the competition, three candles were set up for each competitor at 30 yards. Each person was to shoot each candle 4 times. If you hit wax, your shot didn't count. We had three people tie with 5 hits each. For the initial tie-breaker, we moved the candles back 10 more yards. Two people tied for winner's spot, so they were each given six candles in which to shoot. Doug Miller (California) won with a score of 2. The Troyer came in at an unbelievable 400 +/-.

On Saturday, March 1 at 9:30 a.m., with 28 shooters competing, 4<sup>th</sup> Annual ROT Field Target Competition began. We all enjoyed a wonderful Texas BBQ luncheon after the match. On Saturday afternoon, the games began, with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Republic of Texas Man on Man Double Elimination Red Ryder BB Gun Shoot off. If you think that's a mouthful, you should have seen everyone blowing their "hot air" into the balloons (targets for the competition.) To save our "hot air" for bragging rights later, Chad Reno thought of the wonderful idea of using an air tank for blowing up the balloons. Way to go, Chad! Eric Branch (Texas), who has participated in the final Red Ryder shoot off for the last three years, finally won this year's competition, during the shootoff on Sunday. It was a proud moment for Eric to win this highly treasured trophy. After the BB Gun competition, the shooters were in for another treat with the participated in another shoot, the International Field Target Pistol Competition. This was our 2<sup>nd</sup> year for this shoot and it was definitely a hit! The match was 42 shots at standard targets from 10 to 25 yards. Rosie Smith (Louisiana) was the winner of this competition. Congrats, Rosie! The NRA Pistol Silhouette match was scheduled just before dawn, but we ran out of time, so watch for this one next year! At 7:30 p.m. on Saturday evening, we held the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Spotlight Field Target Competition. The only rules for this match are: 1) Be safe; and 2) You must hold your own light. This match was great fun and definitely something to participate in if you haven't tried it.

On Sunday, March 2, we kicked off the final day of the ROT competition with the shooter's meeting. This very windy, partly cloudy day provided some what of change in weather conditions for the 28 shooters. You could definitely tell that some were relieved and some were very worried!

When everyone returned with scorecards and final scores were posted, a shoot off between Doug Miller (California) and Warren Williamson (Ohio) determined the winner of this year's match. Doug Miller won the competition with a 40 yard shot at a 1/2 inch kill zone. Congratulations to Doug and also Warren for providing some fine competition. It was a crowd pleaser to be able to watch these two highly-skilled competitors shoot against 20 mph winds. Way to go, guys!

After the Field Target match shoot off and the final Red Ryder competition, (Eric Branch, winner), the shooters enjoyed authentic Mexican food, catered by Las Fuentes. Lunch was followed by the awards ceremony and group pictures. Shortly after the pictures, the shooters began to make their way back home to various places such as Tennessee, Ohio, California, and Louisiana and for those of us who live here in Texas, just down the road a piece. I just want to tell everyone what a wonderful time we had as hosts for our 4<sup>th</sup> Annual ROT Field Target Competition.
