GREAT LAKES 100 2005 HUNTER CLASS

- The competitor must declare his/her intention to participate as a Hunter Class shooter at the time of registration.
- All participants of the Hunter Class will shoot the same course of fire as all contestants in the Great Lakes 100, using targets designated by the RangeMaster/Match Director.
- No range finding. The scope objective lens/focus cannot be adjusted once a target has been viewed through the scope. The scope objective lens/focus cannot be changed until all required shots are completed on a particular target.
- No adjustment of the elevation or windage turrets during the match.
- The shooter may use any shooting position provided the rifle barrel is between the lane markers when firing.
- No straps or jackets.
- Hunter Class awards will be from first through fifth place

Republic Of Texas Field Target Roundup
Match Report – May 14, 2005

With temperatures in the high-70's to low-80's, clear skies, and light winds, 27 shooters attended the first annual "Republic Of Texas" FT match, at the Yegua Gun Range in the state-centric locale of Somerville Texas. The match was hosted by combined efforts from the Yegua Airgun Club and the Central Texas Airgun Club (CTAC).

The classification brake-down was well balanced: 14 PCP and 13 Piston shooters, with 3 seniors and 3 ladies. The course consisted of 10-wooded lanes, all set with gravel-filled shooting boxes. To help us manage "cold" line situations, and taking advantage of the course layout, lanes 1 thru 6 were dubbed as the "South" lanes, and lanes 7 thru 10 were dubbed as the "North" lanes.

The range opened at 8:30 AM, with sight-in and practice areas available until the Texas-style BBQ lunch was served at 11:30 AM. The shooter's briefing was held at 12:30 PM, and the AFTTA-rules match started promptly at 1:00 PM. The course of fire consisted of 60-shots: 3 targets per lane, 2 shots per target. We did have some issues with some targets on the "South" lanes, but they were quickly resolved, and the match ran very smoothly.

Awards were presented for 1st thru 3rd place scores for PCP and Piston divisions, as well as high-overall Senior and Lady. There was tie for 3rd place PCP, which was settled by verbal agreement between the shooters, and also a tie for the Lady award, which was settled by a sudden-death shoot-off. The shoot-off was a crowd pleaser, Linda Juneau and Raschel York captured everyone's attention, and the winner managed to get a loud roar from the crowd. The average target distance was 27 yards, with an average kill-zone of 7/8 inches. The course difficulty was 31.8 on the Troyer scale, which did take into account an extra difficulty factor for all targets on lane 8, due to intrusive direct sunlight at the shooter's box.
