Weather: Variable winds up to 5mph +/- which kept the hot humid air moving making for a very comfortable day.

The day dawned with 30% chance of thunder storms which kept many of the regulars away.

During Sight-in I realized I had forgot to pack pellets into my new soft guncase I will be using for traveling from lane to lane at the matches. This new case (with my marauder Pullpup in it) fits into my Pelican 1700 case (with all the padding removed). During the transition I forgot to pack pellets. So with a quick grab of some non sorted left over pellets that were lubed (when I shoot dry) a quick re-sightin and prayer that they would group got me up and as ready as could be for the match.

9 shooters braved the forecasts for a very enjoyable and dry match. There was a bit of a breeze blowing through which kept the heat circulating making it quite comfortable. On the other hand though that same breeze/wind down range was moving the pellets laterally through the air. Many times I held too much for the wind.

Hector and Veronika will be heading of to shoot at the World FT championships in Norway at the end of the month so this course was designed with each lane having at least one target comparable to what they would find in Norway (excluding the extreme up and down hill angles that our range doesn't allow). This left the course a bit more difficult than I usually design for a mid season match but was very good practice for all. Scores were a bit down by some of us but others prevailed.

Thanks to all that braved the forecasts and the help with pulling in the course. Many hands make it a quick painless job. See you all at the Nationals in September.
