



Port Colborne Field Target Club Results for August 11, 2012

With the folks in Toronto and most points north of Port Colborne experiencing quite a bit of rain, I sent out an email Friday night, letting them know that it was still dry in Port. It was cloudy and cool in the morning and a drop or two fell during sight in. At the end of the shooter's meeting, we had about a three-minute shower and then it was dry for the rest of the match. We had a pretty brisk wind blowing, with some gusts that caused a few pellets to hit the outer edges. Compared to what was around us, we made out very well in the weather department.

On the Wednesday before the match when I ordered the awards, I had six confirmed shooters and a few possible. This was not a real surprise, since the nationals were only two weeks earlier. At match time, fifteen shooters headed out to compete, which left us a little short of awards, but it did not dampen the fun. The difficulty of the match came out at 32T if the wind was not considered. With the wind factor added to only the longest shots, it increased the difficulty to 34+ on the T-difficulty scale.

Three junior shooters took part and having them there always makes things better. Braden is getting his QB dialed in and put in a great performance to claim top spot. Samuel edged Andrew out by a few points to place second.

The hunter division which started out with a few possible competitors, ended up with six shooters vying for one first place medal. Chris N took the top spot, followed by Greg in second, with Marshall close behind in third. James and Chris H were very close and Slav did well with his newly tuned HW97.

The open pcp section featured the usual suspects and some really good performances on a windy day. Don took top honours and Dennis claimed second. Len still managed a decent score with a faulty regulator in his gun. Magdy shot his EV2 under WFTF rules and shot a very good score in his first experience with this style of shooting.

After a broken spring spoiled Ted's score in the Nationals match, he has his TX up and running very well. He took the top spot in the WFTF Piston class with yours truly coming a distant second.

As soon as the shooting was over, we had plenty of help to pull the targets and get them packed away before the presentation of the awards. We actually had pretty well everything wrapped up by 3:30 PM and I would like to thank all who helped, enabling use to get to our fish'n chip spot by about 4:00 PM. Ten of us enjoyed the fish dinners and good conversation.
